


Why Create Child Protection, Harassment, and Sexual Misconduct Policies?

Book of Order Required Risk Reducing Policies

G-3.0106

ALL COUNCILS SHALL ADOPT AND IMPLEMENT THE FOLLOWING POLICIES:

- A SEXUAL MISCONDUCT POLICY,
- A HARASSMENT POLICY.
- A CHILD AND YOUTH PROTECTION POLICY, AND
- AN ANTIRACISM POLICY.

EACH COUNCIL'S POLICY SHALL INCLUDE REQUIREMENTS FOR BOUNDARY TRAINING WHICH INCLUDES THE TOPIC OF SEXUAL MISCONDUCT, AND CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE PREVENTION TRAINING FOR ITS MEMBERS AT LEAST EVERY THIRTY-SIX MONTHS.

Prevention Procedures

- ▶ Leadership
 - ▶ References
 - ▶ Background Checks

 - Certified in first aid & CPR
 - ▶ Signed forms
 - Standards of Ethical Conduct

- ► Physical Space
 - Window or Open door in each room
 - Overnight arrangements, sleeping rooms and restrooms
 - ▶ Use of digital devices
 - ▶ Transportation

Prevention Practices

- Ex: Physical Practices to reduce risk of child abuse
 - ▶ Two Adult Rule
 - Ratios: Adult to Child
 - Activity limitations
 - Code of Expected Conduct
 - Code of Prohibited Conduct

- Church Sponsored Events for Children and Youth
- Church sponsored Events for all generations
- Educational Training
- Written practices and signatures

Prevention Practices

- ▶ Training, Education and Conversations with
 - ▶ Leaders,
 - ▶ Employees
 - ▶ Volunteers
 - ▶ members,
 - people who are vulnerable
